Language requirements	An adequate level of (spoken and written) German is recommended, as most of our courses are held in German. We do not require a language certificate however – neither in German nor in English.
Course catalogue	All courses: <u>https://lfuonline.uibk.ac.at/public/lfuonline_lv.home</u> By clicking 'advanced search' students can also choose the option 'Language of instruction' and change it to 'English', 'French', 'Spanish' etc. → A list with courses taught in English will be available after clicking 'Search'. Exchange students should ideally take between 16 and 30 ECTS credits per semester but they do not have to be from their major. They can also take interdisciplinary courses that are open for students from all fields or even courses from other faculties to a certain extent.
Housing (VERY IMPORTANT)	Student Dorms:         Finding accommodation is a very difficult issue here in Innsbruck. The students must apply as soon as possible after their nomination to get a room in a student dorm.         Students must send the reservation deposit immediately → otherwise the application will not be handled. The rooms are allocated on a first come, first served basis.         Please visit the following link for more information:         https://www.oeadstudenthousing.at/en/accommodation/innsbruck/         Due to the tense housing situation in the first semester, we would highly recommend that students apply for the summer term. Ski and winter sport enthusiasts should know that snow conditions will be good and most ski resorts will be open until mid- or even end of April.

	Free market:         Renting a room or apartment on the free market is very difficult and expensive, especially when you wish to rent for less than 12 months and need furnished accommodation.         The <u>Austrian student union</u> has a website with private room offers and there are some Facebook groups: <u>Wohnungsbörse Innsbruck</u> or <u>Innsbrucker Wohnungsmarkt</u> . A lot of the content is in German but using the Google translate browser plugin usually helps. You might also find favourable monthly rates on AirBnB.         Innsbruck is generally quite a small town, so it does not really matter which part of town you live in.
