Application Deadlines

Registration

Registration of new incoming LMUexchange students takes place in September/October and March/April respectively. You will be informed about registration dates in the official letter of acceptance (Zulassungsbescheid), which you will receive on approval of your Learning Agreement.



Housing

Studying at LMU

Course Information

Consult the online course catalogue at: www.lsf.lmu.de (no login required, simply click on the link "Vorlesungsverzeichnis" to access the online course catalogue.)

The up-to-date course catalogue is available only two months before the beginning of each semester. To get an idea of courses offered, you can consult the catalogue of previous years and faculty websites where there is often general information about choosing courses etc.

As an exchange student you must choose **at least 60%** of your course modules in a single subject area only. You should take **the other 40%** of your course modules in **no more than two further subject areas** (example: 60% of courses in German Philology, 20% of courses in History and 20% of courses in Political Science).

If you have no previous knowledge and study experience in a subject area, you will solely be permitted to take introductory courses in this field. As a rule, bachelor students will not be permitted to take master courses (any exceptions to this rule will be discussed and decided by LMU).

Grading System (www.lmu.de/international/incoming/grading)

At LMU credit for Bachelor and Master Courses is given in accordance with the European Credit Transfer System (ECTS). All coursework will be graded in accordance with the German grading system ("1"–"6", with "1" being the best and "6" the worst grade). A course that is graded between 1 and 4 is passed. Some course are not graded (non-graded lectures).



Language Requirements at LMU

In order to make the most of your experience in Munich and at LMU, it is important to have good German language skills. Although some departments offer modules taught in English, the language of instruction at LMU is generally German, particularly at bachelor level.

At the time of commencing your studies at LMU we strongly recommend you have at least CEFR **level B2** in German. The same proficiency level applies if you plan to take courses in English. Some departments have higher requirements (e.g. English/North American Studies).

If you choose to take only courses taught in English, generally no German language skills are required. There are, however, exceptions to this rule. Further information: www.lmu.de/international/incoming/language

Visa

If you require a visa, you are strongly recommended to submit your online application form and supporting documents **before** the application deadlines for admission to the university.

Insurance

Adequate health insurance is mandatory for all exchange students. We strongly recommend that you arrive with adequate travel insurance to cover you until you are officially registered as a student at LMU. You should then take out German health insurance cover for the duration of your stay at LMU. Be aware that insurance packages for study abroad in your home country may not fulfil the German requirements and will therefore not be accepted. Please note that travel insurance for the duration of your stay **is not enough** and will not be accepted at registration. Accident, personal and third party liability insurance for the duration of your stay in Germany is strongly recommended.
