Accommodation

Finding the right place to live is an important part of your study abroad experience, and Deakin is here to help you feel at home, whether on campus or in the local community.

On-Campus Accommodation

Living on campus offers a safe, supportive, and vibrant student environment. You will become part of a welcoming residential community, with access to free social activities, events, and 24/7 support from reception and security staff.

Accommodation includes fully furnished, single-occupancy bedrooms with access to shared kitchens, bathrooms, laundry facilities, and recreational areas. Some campuses also offer self-contained studio apartments with private bathrooms and kitchenettes. On-campus accommodation is popular, and places are limited, so we recommend applying early.

Off-Campus and Homestay Options

If you prefer to live off campus, Deakin can support you with a range of options. At the offer stage, we will provide a list of off-campus accommodation options, including private rentals, shared houses, and homestay arrangements with local families.

You can also search for accommodation via Deakin's **Houseme** website, where you can browse listings and contact landlords directly. Homestay is a great way to experience everyday Australian life and culture in a supportive home environment. While Deakin provides access to these resources, it is your responsibility to inspect and assess the accommodation before making any commitments.

How to Apply for On-Campus Accommodation

When submitting your Study Abroad and Exchange application, you will be asked to indicate your housing preferences. We recommend applying as early as possible, as places are limited and allocated on a first-come, first-served basis. You will be contacted during the application process with more information on how to proceed.

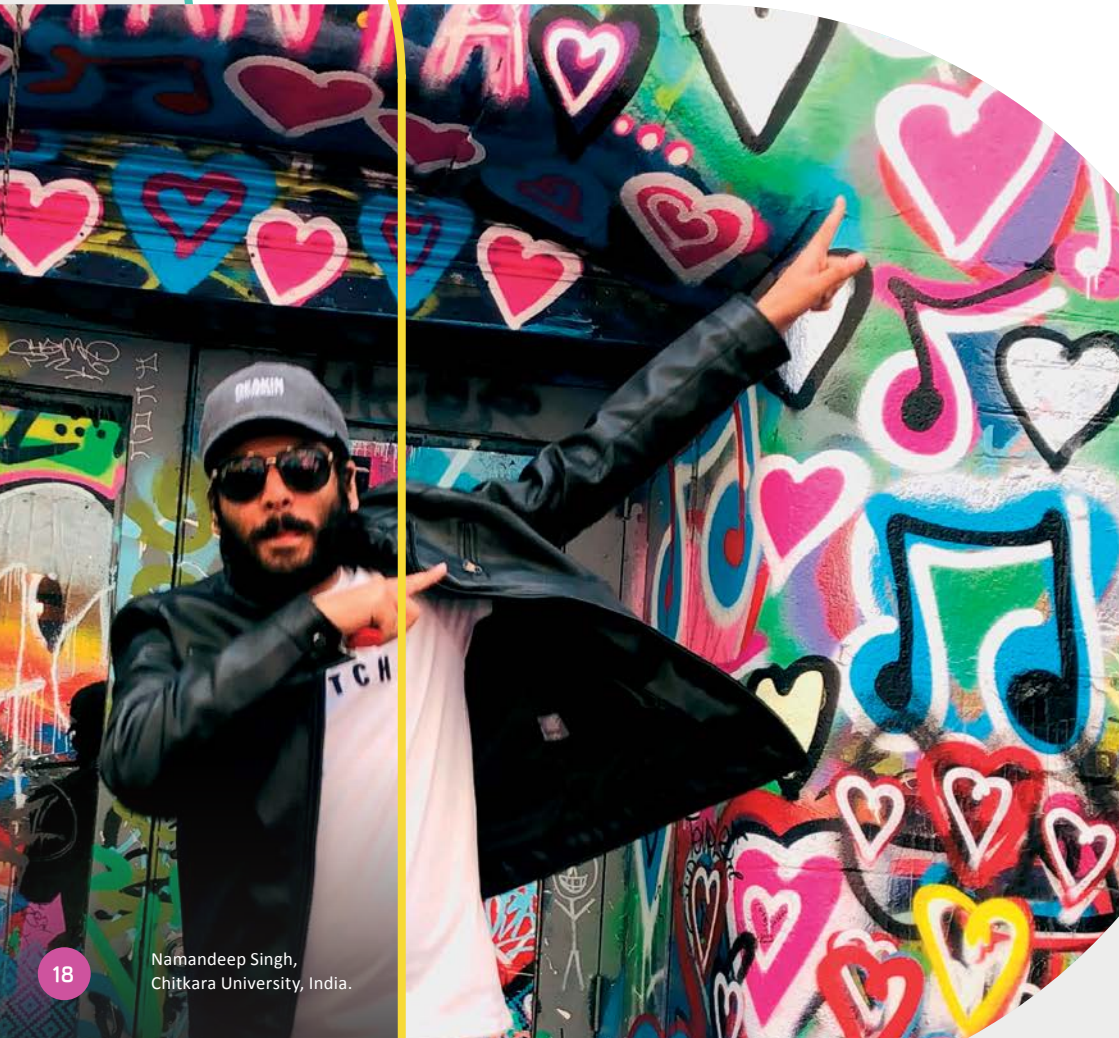

Student visa

If you are coming to Australia on a **student visa (subclass 500)**, it is important to ensure you meet all the requirements. You will need to:

- receive an electronic Confirmation of Enrolment (eCoE) from Deakin
- provide evidence of financial capacity
- meet Genuine Student (GS) criteria
- complete a medical examination if required.

Note: Entry into Australia on a student visa is only permitted for full-time, on-campus study.

Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC)


The Australian Government requires international students to have an **Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC)** for the duration of their stay. This cover helps with the cost of medical care in Australia.

Refund policy

Should your plans change, Deakin has a clear refund policy. Depending on your circumstances and the timing of your withdrawal, you may be eligible for a full or partial refund of tuition fees. Visit our website for full details.

Application process

Before you apply

1

Understand the academic requirements

You must have completed Year 12 or equivalent or have at least two trimesters of full-time study outside Australia. You will also need a minimum GPA of 2.6 out of 4 (or equivalent). See deakin.edu.au/studyabroad for up-to-date information.

Understand the English language requirements

If English is not your first language or the language of instruction at your home institution, documentary evidence of your English skills will be required. Visit deakin.edu.au/english-req for more.



Check the campus and trimester of your preferred units

Before selecting your units, ensure that each unit is available at your chosen campus by checking the Deakin Handbook at deakin.edu.au/handbook. You should also confirm that the units are offered in the trimester you plan to study by referring to the academic calendar at deakin.edu.au/courses/key-dates. Additionally, make sure you meet any listed prerequisites or admission requirements for your selected units.

Nomination

If you are applying through the exchange program, you will receive an application link from us after your home university has officially nominated you.

5

Apply online

Complete the online application available on **How to apply for study abroad and exchange**. Include relevant documents such as your passport, evidence of your academic qualifications and/or transcript, and proof of English language proficiency (if applicable). You will also need to list at least five to six units per trimester, in case certain units are unavailable in your trimester of choice.

Acceptance procedures

If your application is successful, you will receive a Letter of Offer listing the units of study you have approval to enrol in, any tuition fees (if applicable), and the **Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC)** information. The letter will outline how to accept the offer and the next steps. To avoid any delays, accept your offer as soon as possible.

Apply for a student visa


After you accepted your offer, we will issue your electronic Confirmation of Enrolment (eCoE) document, which you need to apply for your **student visa**. Once your visa is granted, you are all set to begin your journey at Deakin University in Australia!
